Introduction

- Gives a common purpose
- Fosters a feeling of pride

We ask that all pupils wear the uniform and we encourage them to maintain a good standard of clean and tidy dress in school.

Our school colours are black and red.

Our school uniform is not gender specific, and is made up as follows:-

Winter Uniform

Red polo shirt
Black trousers/skirt
Black sweater/cardigan
Black shoes

Summer Uniform

Red polo shirts
Black trousers (long or short)/ Red gingham/striped dresses
Black sweaters/cardigans
Black shoes

PE

Black shorts and a white t-shirt
Black plimsolls (indoors)
Trainers (outdoors)

Welsh Government Pupil Development Grant

At the time of writing, pupils eligible for free school meals can apply for this grant (£125) for the academic year if they are:

- Entering reception class or year 3 in primary school
- Entering year 7 or year 10 in secondary school
- Aged 4, 7, 11 or 14 in special schools, special needs resource bases or pupil referral units
- Looked After Children are eligible for the grant regardless of which school year they are entering.
